Resource Grid

1. Immediately assign a point person for the youth
2. Point person will introduce themselves to the youth and let them know that they will be helping to make sure that they receive quality care and can also help them access other services by making referrals if needed.
3. Point person will track care within GIRL Project, ensure that youth understands what is going on with safety plan/support, follow up with youth when necessary, make referrals to youth specific services if needed.
